Funding Smiles:

Three Organizations Partner to Provide 13 Adaptive Tricycles to Houston-Area Children

Houston, Texas – 12.8.2018 – On January 12, 2019 at 10 am in the atrium of Shriners Hospital for Children — Houston, 13 children will receive a second dose of holiday cheer in the form of a brand new shiny red bike. Not just any bike, though, an Amtryke.

These adaptive tricycles were chosen by their physical or occupational therapist and custom built to suit each of their special needs. Hundreds of available adaptive accessories - including seats, handlebars, hand assists, foot assists, side support and more – overcome the riding challenges of each. Most, becoming successful riders for the first time ever. Members of the media and public are welcome to attend what promises to be an incredibly uplifting event.

Members of the media may also find the bike build of interest. On Friday, January 11 from 1 to 5 pm in the Shriners' atrium, nine members of Longview AMBUCS, therapists and students from Houston Medical Center and some Shriners patients will work together to build the 13 trykes.

Local therapists are also encouraged to visit the Shriners Hospital atrium on Friday, January 11 from 1 to 5 pm or on Saturday, January 12 from 8 to 10 am to view and demo Amtryke adaptive tricycles with their clients who would benefit.

So, how did this second holiday miracle come about? It all started with the Longview, Texas-based AMBUCS chapter and their yearly effort as Santa's Helpers. Each year they print out all the riders waiting for Amtryke funding within 500 miles and ask their 100 members, "If you are going to, through or near any of these locations on your Holiday travels and you have space in your vehicle, why not take a detour to make a deserving child happy?" They routinely take dozens off the list, funding and delivering joy throughout Texas and neighboring states...and even as far away as Kentucky.

This year they noticed a cluster of 13 riders within 30 miles of Houston and got to work. They contacted Variety – The Children's Charity of Texas and pitched the organization on "\$10,000 to fund 13 ride-ready Amtrykes, adapted to each recipient's specific physical needs as instructed by a licensed physical therapist."

Supportive of this collaborative effort, Variety's Ruthie Hanna said, "We are thrilled to partner with AMBUCS and Shriners to provide the gift of mobility to such deserving children. We understand the value of exercise, activity and quality recreational time alongside friends and family. That's what Variety is all about."

The chapter also reached out to each of the referring therapists to identify a host site for the giveaway. The Shriners Hospital quickly stepped forward as a host for the build, display and giveaway.
